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


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ALL KERALA MATHEMATICS FEST.


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SURVEY ON SENSITIVE ISSUES AMONG SCHOOL CHILDREN








TRANSITION - Short film gender sensitization-9th November 2023

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
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ALL KERALA MATHEMATICS FEST 2K23




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Fraternize-Social Science Club's Road Safety Week Initiative




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DIGITALL: ADVANCING GENDER EQUALITY THROUGH INNOVATION-WOMENS DAY CELEBRATION March 8th, 2023

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


VIMUKTHI CLUB'S DRIVE AGAINST DRUGS: VEHICLE STICKER CAMPAIGN


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"EMPOWERING ECO-FRIENDLY PRACTICES: PAPER BAG MAKING WORKSHOP"

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
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A VISIT TO AMRITHA SPEECH AND HEARING IMPROVEMENT SCHOOL

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
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PATHEYAM AND SHARING IS CARING FOR INMATES OF BADHSAIDHA








World Science Day Mobile Photography Competition

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
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PAAPPAM FOOD FEST: SUPPORTING OUR PLAY WITH TASTY TREATS




