Feedback Analysis Report 2019-20

Following the feedback collected from students, alumni, teachers, practice teaching schools, and employers regarding the curriculum, an action plan were developed to address key areas for improvement. The primary focus areas included increased use of ICT by both teacher educators and students and the integration of more community-based classrooms. The steps taken to implement these suggestions are outlined below. Feedback from various stakeholders emphasized the need to enhance ICT integration in the curriculum. There is a significant need for classes covering a variety of online platforms and digital tools that support teaching and learning. By broadening the scope beyond commonly used platforms, such as Google Classroom and Zoom, educators and students can gain proficiency in canva and kinemaster. This exposure will increase digital literacy, encourage adaptability, and enable students and teachers to make informed decisions when selecting platforms for specific needs. A structured series of sessions focusing on both theoretical and practical knowledge will be beneficial. Regular counseling sessions tailored to address the emotional and mental well-being of both teachers and students are highly recommended. Similarly, during Covid pandemic students face stress and academic pressures that can impact learning outcomes. Frequent counseling sessions, addressing topics like stress management and emotional regulation would create a more supportive learning atmosphere, fostering a healthier academic environment overall. To make the mentor-mentee program more effective, it would be helpful to adopt a more structured approach. Suggestions include clearly defining mentor and mentee roles, establishing regular meeting schedules, and introducing goal-oriented activities.

These enhancements would contribute to a more holistic curriculum that supports academic, emotional, and practical needs. Implementing them will help create an environment where both teachers and students are well-equipped to thrive in a modern educational landscape.
